

Right Care, Right Person

Does it fit the bill?

The police are the relevant agency to contact in the following situations:

Concern for a Child

When police action is required at that time, to prevent a child suffering or being likely to suffer significant harm.

Mental Health

There is a real and immediate threat to life, or risk of serious harm.

Physical Health

Whilst GMP have an obligation to respond to real and immediate threats to life or risk of serious harm, the primary response to physical health concerns should always be directed to the health service or the North West Ambulance Service (NWAS).

Social Issues

A social concern where there is an immediate risk to life or risk of serious harm.

Missing Persons

When a missing person is considered to be high-risk (where there is a very likely risk of serious harm to the person or the public) or where the person isn't considered to be high-risk and you have conducted all reasonable enquiries to establish the person's whereabouts.

Forced Entry

NWAS should be informed of a medical issue. NWAS should then contact Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service if forced entry is required. Greater Manchester Police will support if needed.
